In pursuance of the provisions of clause (3) of Article 348 of the Constitution of India, the Governor is pleased to order the publication of the following English translation of the Uttaranchal Medical Council Act, 2062 (Uttaranchal Adhiniyam Sankhya 17 of 2002).
